One of the Fifth Generation of Chinese Directors; Photographer; Professor of the Communication University of China.

Born in Beijing in 1957, he fell in love with painting since childhood. He was recruited by the Feature Film Shooting major in the Department of photography in Beijing Film Academy in 1978, together with Zhang Yimou, Gu Changwei and Zhao Fei. In 1982, he became a teacher in Beijing Film Academy being the top graduate. In 1983, for the first time he worked as the photographer of a fiction film "Road". Then in 1985, he shot the avant-garde experimental film "Song of Ancient Hunting". In 2008, he directed the first stereo magic realism horror film "The Lonely Spirit in an Old Building", which earned him much attention. After 8 years being a teacher, he earned full scholarship and started his Master study in School of the Art Institute of Chicago. After his graduation in 1994, he started the China Television in the US and worked there as the Director and Chief Editor.

Back in China in 1997, he worked in the Communication University of China. Now he is the professor, Ph.D. supervisor, Director of the Department of Photography and Director of the Film Laboratory there.
