

**2021/2022 Academic year**  
**In-person Registration for Undergraduate and Pre-U students**  
**Epidemic Prevention and Control Measures for New Students and Parents**

1. Pay close attention to the Preventive Measures and Quarantine Measures Upon Arrival of the Macao SAR government.
2. All individuals arriving in Macao must hold a Macao Health Code, a proof of negative COVID-19 nucleic acid test, as well as a valid entry permit. Individuals arriving in Macao from Zhuhai, Guangdong Province, please learn about the relevant policy for entering Guangdong Province, and must hold a Guangdong Health Code for exiting Zhuhai and a Macao Health Code for entering Macao. For more details, please read the “Arriving SAR Macao from Zhuhai Steps to Make Health Declaration”.
3. Cooperate with the preventive measures of Macao SAR government and the University, including: take the temperature check, wear masks, crowd control measure, provide Health Code, keep a social distance, health management, medical observation, and etc.
4. Take your own temperature measurement. Individuals with forehead temperature at 37.5°C or above or acute respiratory tract infection symptoms should delay the in-person registration and contact the Academic Registry, meanwhile must wear masks and consult doctor immediately.
5. New students must login to the WeMust Student APP and complete the Health Declaration every day.
6. Must hold a green Macao Health Code and wear a mask to enter the campus and buildings. New students with yellow or red Macao Health Code should contact the Academic Registry immediately, so as to make necessary adjustments to the in-person registration arrangement.
7. Wear a mask during the whole process of in-person registration, no food or drink, and keep a distance of at least one meter with others. Pay attention to your personal, hands, and environmental hygiene in order to avoid cross infection.
8. Avoid crowd gathering and using elevator during the in-person registration process, and use different routes to reach the destination. In order to reduce crowd gathering, please follow the on-site instruction to queue or wait, and use designated route and doorway to enter or leave the venues or parent resting zone.
9. To reduce the risk and impact of COVID-19 on students’ academic progress, students should stay in Macao and avoid any unnecessary travel and border crossing after arrival. Students should carefully assess the necessity of crossing the border and be prepared to bear the consequences of their own actions.
10. If students cannot come to Macao in the case of force majeure, students must provide a written document to the Academic Registry explaining the current situation, along with the relevant supporting documents and the expected in-person registration date.
11. Pay attention to the latest information released by the Macao SAR government and the University, and take personal anti-epidemic measures for protection.
