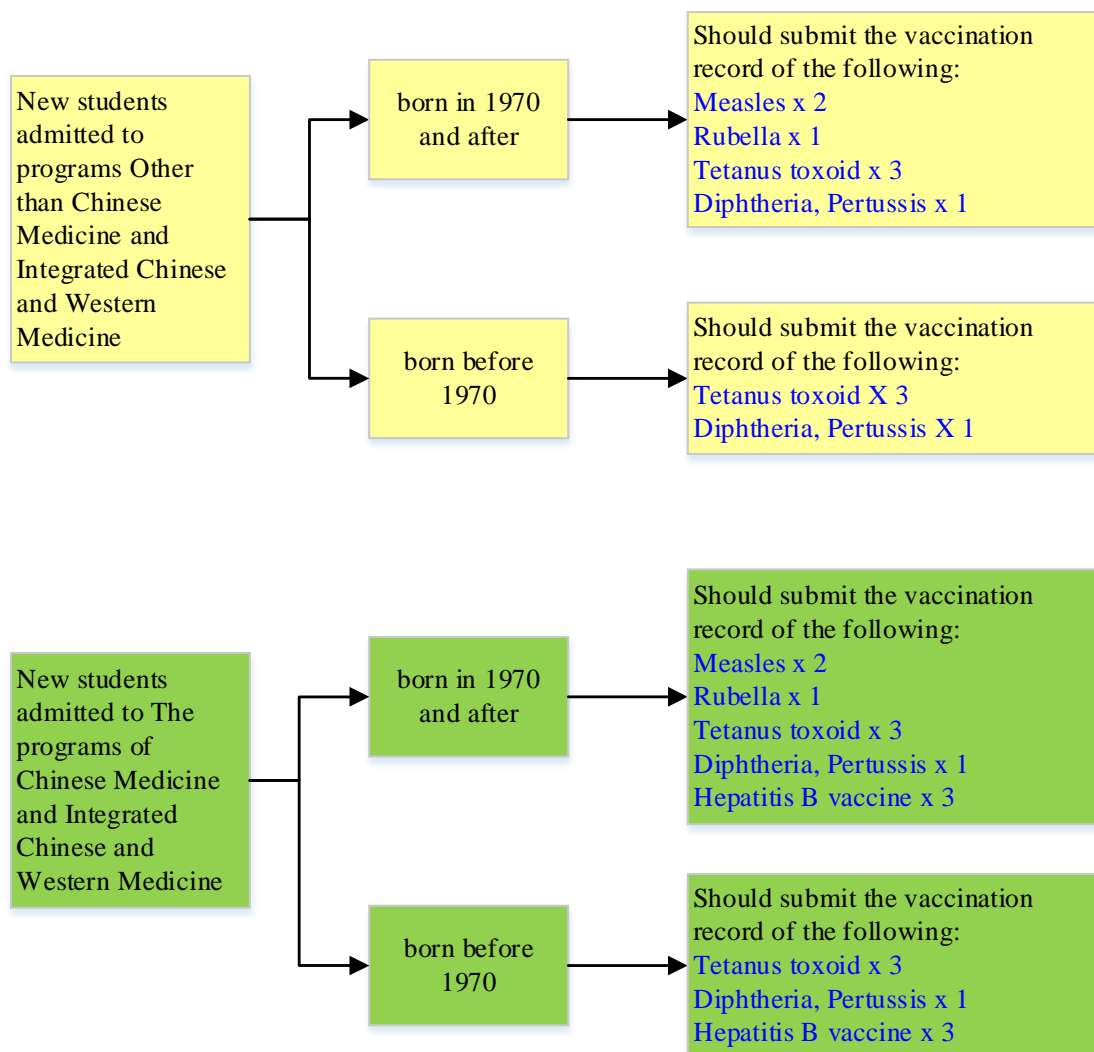


Vaccination Q&A

1. Do postgraduate new students need vaccines before admission? Why?

A: Certain infectious diseases are spreading widely around the world. Schools are high-risk groups, so vaccination requirements must be met before admission to prevent infection. For vaccination requirements, please refer to point 4 in “Guidelines for Health Examination”.



Remark: Students from Pakistan, Nigeria and Afghanistan should inject at least four doses of Poliomyelitis in addition to the above requirements.

2. Are Measles and Rubella vaccine the same?

A : It is different.

3. I have received the DPT vaccine, does this include pertussis, diphtheria, tetanus vaccine? How many doses does it count?

A : Yes, each counts one dose. The last dose of tetanus vaccine should be injected within the recent 10 years.



4. What happen if the result of my health examination does not meet the requirements?

A: It depends on which item that does not meet the requirement. Please contact the School of Graduate Studies immediately if this happens.

5. I am a local citizen of Macao SAR. What documents do I need to submit for proof of vaccination?

A: Medical certificate / Individual Vaccination Booklet / Vaccination Card issued by the Macau Health Bureau or hospital.

6. I am not a local citizen of Macao SAR. What documents do I need to submit for proof of vaccination?

A: Vaccination certificate issued by the authorized institution / department in permanent residence, stamp should be clearly visible on the certificate. Students should provide both the original and copy of the vaccination certificate (Students should turn in the copy of the vaccination certificate on the day of the health examination, the original copy will be given to the doctor for checking)

7. Under what circumstances can vaccination be exempted?

A: Please refer to section 4.3 in the “Guidelines for Health Examination”.

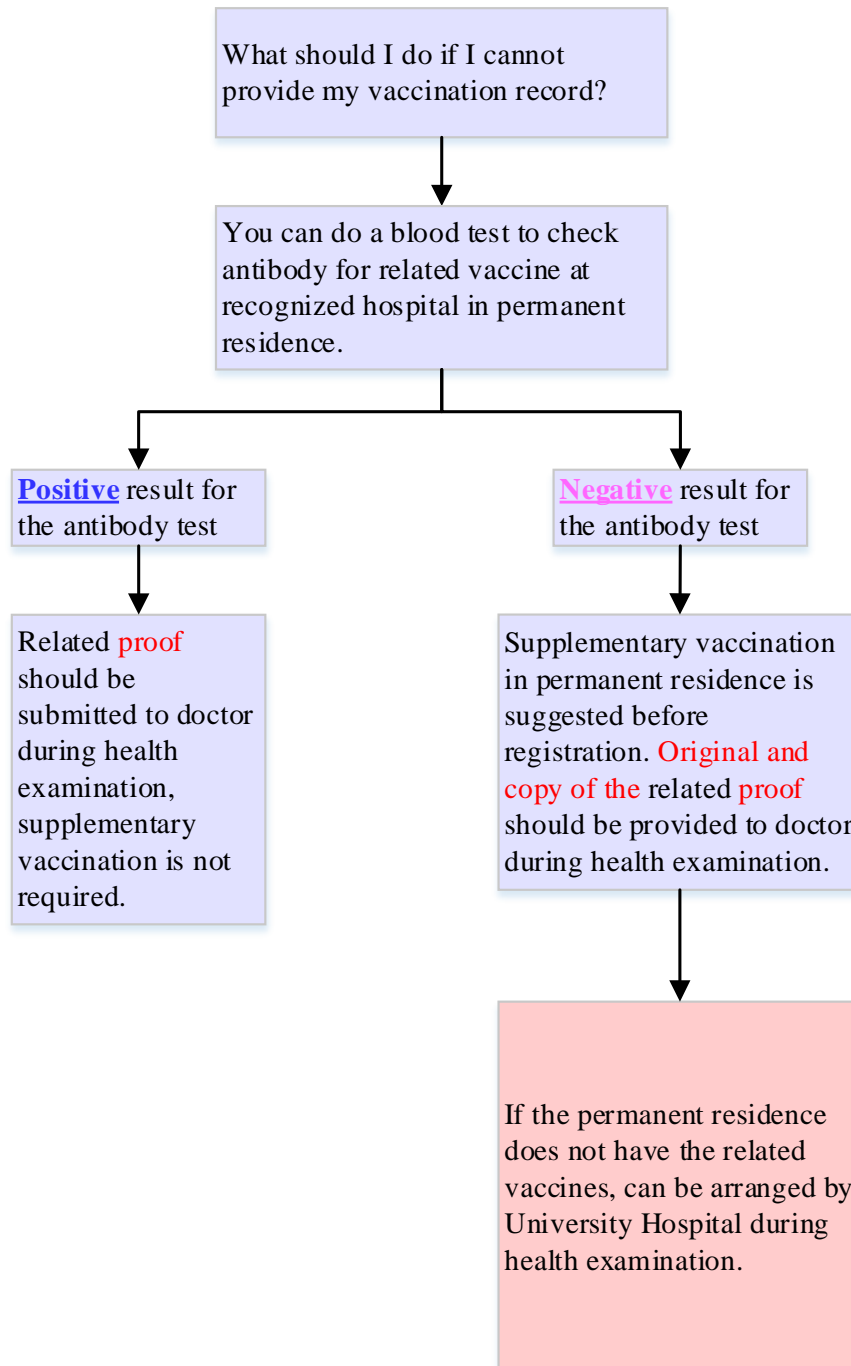
8. Can vaccination be exempted if I am pregnant?

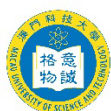
A : During early pregnancy, please provide the proof of pregnancy to exempt, It is also recommended to vaccinate giving birth.



9. What should I do if I cannot find my vaccination record?

A: Vaccination record can be applied from authorized institution / department in permanent residence, or the medical institution of place of birth. You are recommended to pay and do the blood test for related antibody in case of failure to apply. Vaccination is required if one of the antibody is missing.





10. Are all the vaccines mentioned in “Guidelines for Health Examination” available to inject at the University Hospital? Are there any extra charges?

A: Diphtheria and Pertussis vaccines are unavailable. And appointment should be made at least two months in advance for other vaccines (No appointment is needed for Tetanus toxoid vaccine). Please refer to the table below for details of charges (All fees are subject to change according to the latest announcement(s) by the University Hospital, and the relevant vaccines are reserved according to the actual situation of the University Hospital):

Charges of vaccination at the University Hospital* (additional \$195 of consultation fee will be charged)

Charges of antibody test: (Consultation fee will not be charged if the antibody test is done during the health examination, otherwise additional \$195 of consultation fee will be charged.)

*Results of all antibody tests take at least 7 working days. Appointment for vaccination should be made at least two months in advance.

*Remarks: Due to covid 19, test samples cannot be sent to Hong Kong for inspection. Antibody test is temporarily unavailable.

11. I am not a Hepatitis B patient but a Hepatitis B carrier. Am I qualified to admit?

A : If you are proved to be a Hepatitis B carrier by doctor, please notify the doctor during health examination and let the doctor determine whether follow up is needed. But this will not affect your admission qualification.
